3 Ideas

Below are 3 ideas for creating video for teachers (You).

1. 'Sub' Days

The next time you need to miss class, instead of writing out detailed instructions for the sub (what a nightmare, right?) just record a video of you telling the students what they need to do.

2. Flip the Script

Consider recording your 'lecture' in advance and assign viewing it as homework. Spend the next day in class, working through hands-on homework.

3. Record Feedback

When reviewing research papers make notes on the digital file. Then record your screen as you talk about the notes, including praise and corrections. Share the video feedback to the student directly.
